Evening Lesson

AMAZING GRACE Eph. 2:8, 9

INTRO:

- 1. If we are saved, it is by the grace of God.
- 2. However, grace alone does not save any more than faith alone.

I. AMAZING GRACE.

A. Though all have earned death and eternal condemnation, God gives eternal life to his people as a free gift.

Rom. 6:23

- B. Some think of this gift as commonplace for a loving God How could a loving and gracious God condemn anybody? Gen. 18:25
 - 1. Righteous judgment condemns the guilty without partiality.
 - 2. Everyone who appears before him in judgment deserves death, yet God forgives sins and declares guilty ones to be righteous.
- C. Amazingly, God loved us enough to send his Son to die in our place. 2 Cor. 5:21
- D. His grace is truly amazing!

II. ABOUNDING GRACE.

- A. Rom. 5:20; Psalm 103:8, 12
- B. Paul says the grace of God abounded toward him.

1 Tim. 1:12-16

C. You cannot so sin that the grace of God will not be sufficient for you.

III. RESISTIBLE GRACE.

- A. "Irresistible grace" is one of the tenets of Calvinism.
- B. Scripture says that God's grace has appeared to all men. Tit. 2:11
 - 1. If grace cannot be rejected, everyone would be saved.
 - 2. Jesus says this is not the case. Matt. 7:13

IV. CONDITIONAL GRACE.

- A. Grace must be accepted by faith. Eph. 2:8, 9
- B. A gift is not earned, but must be accepted to be of benefit. Heb. 11:8, 17, 30; Mark 16:16, 1 John 1:7
